

Highest in DAVV: ₹20L pay pack for 6 in IET

Indore: It's job season at DAVV and over 65% students have been placed in the first phase of campus placements that concluded recently.

Of the 71% engineering students of Institute of Engineering Technology (IET), six bagged highest package of Rs 20 lakh per annum from Bangalore's product-based company. Out of the six students, four are from Information Technology (IT) and two are from Computer Science

(CS) branch.

Though there has been a decline in number of students opting for engineering, the department has managed to majority of its students placed in the first phase itself. Even the highest package was bagged by engineering students, convener of the DAVV's placement cell, Dr Nitin Nagar told TOI. Out of over 432 final year engineering students, over 308 students have already received

job offers. Whereas out of the 240 CS and IT students over 200 have already been placed in various firms and some of the firms still haven't completed their process yet. "A couple of companies are likely to declare their results soon and

we are expecting more students to get placed," said Nagar.

"Out of the 557 eligible candidates of the three university teaching departments (UTDs) 365 candidates got job offers. Students of masters of

had appeared for the placement.

The students that had appeared for the first phase of placement managed to get over 550 offers as some of the students got more than two offers. "The number of placement has increased this year. There are some of the companies that haven't yet declared the result and that will increase the number of placements," DAVV central placement cell head DAVV Govind Maheshwari told TOI. The average package of the students was Rs 7.2 lakh per annum.

Last year around 10 companies had come for on-campus placement in the first phase, this year the number of companies that come for on-campus placement has also shot up to nearly 26.

As per the eligibility criteria set by the varsity, the student needs to secure minimum 60% in both the board examinations as well as the undergraduate and postgraduate course. The placement cell had selected the candidates for placement based on the eligibility criteria, said Maheshwari.
