(3) The candidates who apply for revaluation may in anticipation of their result of revaluation apply for admission to the ensuing examination (before the last date fixed for the purpose with prescribed fee) for candidate is declared pass as a result of revaluation his application form shall be transferred to next higher class on payment of the difference of fee, if any, but such candidate shall not be permitted to apply for admission to an examination after the last date fixed for the purpose.
